Please park carefully in the mornings. We have had several occasions this week of people parking on pavements and therefore blocking the safe passage of children to school. Parking must be safe and considerate. Please do not:

Park on the pavement

Block in other cars

Block the access of the residents of the houses in The Crescent or School Lane Park on the Yellow ZigZags - this is illegal, the markings are there for child safety Overtake during drop off - this is extremely dangerous

Please also:

Park in sequence on the gravelled car park on the left - from the front to the back, this will fit more cars in.

Ensure you park efficiently - don't take up too much space

Don't park on the bends - this stops other cars getting round and blocks pavements Consider parking by the church. There are spaces just past the duck pond on the right.



Once you have parked please ensure you use the pavements. Please supervise your children and do not let them run off - even crossing to the park can be dangerous. We all need to work together for the safety of our children.
