We won the Scarecrow competition, made some beautiful wreaths for Remembrance and created recycled Easter Gardens. We took part in the Bishop's Appeal Launch - 'Give peas a chance'. We celebrated Holi through Bollywood dancing and a paint festival. We have also had visitors in to talk to us about the Jewish faith and being a Methodist.

Every child created Christmas crafts and we had our Christmas Fair, complete with Father Christmas. He also visited every class and brought them a present. The children held a community carol afternoon for invited guests from the village and helpers.

Some year groups have been over to the farm for egg collecting and woodland walks to see the bluebells. We made birdfeeders and hung them in our grounds.

We hosted and performed at the Mothers' Day Tea Party and made a variety of 'flight based' items during Dads' afternoon. Everyone dressed up for World Book Day and enjoyed sharing favourite stories.

EYFS have held a Queen's tea party and made sandwiches for Paddington Bear. There has been baking for fundraising too for Sarah as well as a PJ day.

We had a 'mad scientist in - Professor Brainstorm who performed a roadshow and helped children to conduct experiments.
