After waiting for the past 6 weeks, the Inspection Report has arrived. Along with this newsletter, you will also have been emailed a copy of the report to read before it is made available to the general public sometime next week.

We are proud to be able to share with you today, that Ardeley St. Lawrence School has been graded once again as a Good school. Here are just a few highlights from the report:

Pupils love their school because they learn well, play happily and feel safe. Pupils know that their teachers care about them. Pupils' welfare is at the forefront of every adult's mind. Pupils say there is always an adult to help them if they ever have a concern.

Pupils have high expectations of their own and others' behaviour. This is because their teachers have helped instil important values such as respect, kindness and tolerance.















Bullying almost never happens. Should it occur, pupils know staff will deal with it immediately.

Pupils are motivated and enthusiastic about their learning.

Leaders have constructed a broad and ambitious curriculum in line with their vision to equip pupils with the knowledge they need for the future.

Pupils strive to move on to the next level of their reading book because they enjoy reading so much.

Leaders make sure that pupils with special educational needs and/or disabilities receive good quality provision.

Pupils' behaviour is positive in lessons and around the school. Pupils are respectful to each other, their teachers and visitors.

We are delighted with the report and are proud to be able to share it with you today. The children were excellent ambassadors of the school and of each other. Their voice in this report speaks out clearly. What is without doubt, is how much the children love their school, those within it, and their learning.

As for the whole staff team - they were amazing before the inspection, during it, and remain so afterwards. They always do their best for the School and its children and the Ofsted result is well deserved. Well done Team!

We designed cars that are different.


























Scarlet Fever alert - We have had some cases in school, it is doing the rounds please be alert to the signs. Thank you.

Signs and Symptoms of Scarlet Fever

Scarlet fever is a common childhood infection. The early symptoms include sore throat, headache, fever, nausea and vomiting. After 12 to 48 hours the characteristic red, pinhead rash develops, typically first appearing on the chest and stomach, then rapidly spreading to other parts of the body, and giving the skin a sandpaper-like texture. The scarlet rash may be harder to spot on darker skin, although the 'sandpaper' feel should be present.

Patients typically have flushed cheeks and pallor around the mouth. This may be accompanied by a 'strawberry tongue'. As the child improves peeling of the skin can occur. Infections can be spread through direct physical contact with people or surfaces. Children with scarlet fever <u>must</u> remain away from school for <u>24 hours after</u> the start of appropriate antibiotic treatment has started.
