Some possible good news if you currently pay for school dinners! I came across this little-known information on a government website this week about entitlement to free meals. We are all feeling the pinch – perhaps this could help you?

Free School Meals: Government guidance 22.10.2022

The guidance permanently extends free school meal eligibility to children in all households with no recourse to public funds (NRPF), subject to maximum income thresholds. There is an application form for families and carers to verify your eligibility.

For those families with no recourse to public funds (NRPF): The government has also permanently extended free school meal eligibility to children in all households with no recourse to public funds.

School cannot however, use the eligibility checking system (ECS) to confirm your eligibility you will not be in receipt of Universal Credit or legacy benefits. The maximum income threshold differs based on your location and the number of children that your family has.

Under the permanent extension of free school meal eligibility to all NRPF groups, the

£22,700 for families outside of London with 1 child

£26,300 for families outside of London with 2 or more children

In addition to these thresholds, families must hold no more than £16,000 in capital and savings.

Hello, this week KS1 used the computers to create firework pictures! They logged on all by themselves and were great at taking turns and following instructions ©




















Scarlet Fever alert - We have had some cases in school, it is doing the rounds please be alert to the signs. Thank you.

#### Signs and Symptoms of Scarlet Fever

Scarlet fever is a common childhood infection. The early symptoms include sore throat, headache, fever, nausea and vomiting. After 12 to 48 hours the characteristic red, pinhead rash develops, typically first appearing on the chest and stomach, then rapidly spreading to other parts of the body, and giving the skin a sandpaper-like texture. The scarlet rash may be harder to spot on darker skin, although the 'sandpaper' feel should be present.

Patients typically have flushed cheeks and pallor around the mouth. This may be accompanied by a 'strawberry tongue'. As the child improves peeling of the skin can occur. Infections can be spread through direct physical contact with people or surfaces. Children with scarlet fever <u>must</u> remain away from school for **24 hours after** the start of appropriate antibiotic treatment has started.
