

Scarlet Fever alert - We have had some cases in school, it is doing the rounds please be alert to the signs. Thank you.

Signs and Symptoms of Scarlet Fever

Scarlet fever is a common childhood infection. The early symptoms include sore throat, headache, fever, nausea and vomiting. After 12 to 48 hours the characteristic red, pinhead rash develops, typically first appearing on the chest and stomach, then rapidly spreading to other parts of the body, and giving the skin a sandpaper-like texture. The scarlet rash may be harder to spot on darker skin, although the 'sandpaper' feel should be present.

Patients typically have flushed cheeks and pallor around the mouth. This may be accompanied by a 'strawberry tongue'. As the child improves peeling of the skin can occur. Infections can be spread through direct physical contact with people or surfaces. Children with scarlet fever <u>must</u> remain away from school for <u>24 hours after</u> the start of appropriate antibiotic treatment has started.













A polite reminder...

This is an updated extract on an issue first reported in the Newsletter Number 2 in September 2022.

We have been made aware that one or two parents are not clear about the expectations concerning when they should collect their children from school. So for clarity's sake I would like to share what the new arrangements are:

School ends at 3:20 pm. That is when we expect our parents to collect their children. There should <u>not</u> be an expectation that staff are available to look after children after the school has closed to pupils. Even though we still have teachers on the premises, they are busy with their planning, marking and preparation for the next day. This is not at all unusual and is in line with the practice of the vast majority of schools.

If you find that you are going to be late, you are most welcome to let us know and use the School's after school facility. The rates are £5 for the first hour (or part there of) and £15 for the full session ending promptly at 6pm, which includes a hot tea.
