



This week, Upper Key Stage 2 were lucky to have an expert from the Natural History Museum giving them a live online workshop about evolution. They had a mission to discover why lizards, from a particular region of the planet, are changing. They have already been looking into why birds with certain beak shapes are able to survive better than others from their science enquiries in class where they explored which beak shaped tools are best at picking up seeds.

Scarlet Fever alert - We have had some cases in school, it is doing the rounds please be alert to the signs. Thank you.

Signs and Symptoms of Scarlet Fever

Scarlet fever is a common childhood infection. The early symptoms include sore throat, headache, fever, nausea and vomiting. After 12 to 48 hours the characteristic red, pinhead rash develops, typically first appearing on the chest and stomach, then rapidly spreading to other parts of the body, and giving the skin a sandpaper-like texture. The scarlet rash may be harder to spot on darker skin, although the 'sandpaper' feel should be present.

Patients typically have flushed cheeks and pallor around the mouth. This may be accompanied by a 'strawberry tongue'. As the child improves peeling of the skin can occur. Infections can be spread through direct physical contact with people or surfaces. Children with scarlet fever <u>must</u> remain away from school for <u>24 hours after</u> the start of appropriate antibiotic treatment has started.
