Elsewhere in Geography we have been looking at the parts of a river. I was so impressed by how much key vocabulary the children can remember and how well they responded to their learning.



Alternatively, for a quicker response, you can email the school at the admin@ardeley.herts.sch.uk The mail box is being regularly monitored during school hours, and so someone will respond and let you know they have received your message, and taken whatever action necessary.

May I just remind those few parents who need it, that all of the staff (and indeed volunteers working on behalf of the school) at Ardeley are working very hard to ensure that the children enjoy an enriching and happy experience at their school. It is not helpful to the wellbeing of the Ardeley team, if they are on the receiving end of what can only be politely described as rude and hurtful comments either in person or on social media. We teach the children to use their words wisely as words can cause damage, and that if they have nothing kind to say, then often it is better to say nothing rather than cause hurt and upset.

Can I ask please, that if there are any concerns, that you either raise the issue in a respectful manner with the relevant member of staff, or make an appointment to see me and we can have a talk about it.

I would take this moment to draw your attention to the Parent Code of Conduct (available on the school website). I have copied an extract below for your reference:

Conduct

We welcome visitors to our building and act to ensure it remains a safe place for children, staff and other members of our school community. We expect that parents will respect children, parent and staff confidentiality and communicate any concerns, queries and questions in a calm and controlled manner. However, should anyone act in an abusive or threatening manner they will be required to leave the building; any meeting or telephone call will be brought to a close. Ardeley St Lawrence Primary School will not tolerate incidents of swearing, verbal abuse, aggressive body language, threatening behaviour or racist/sexist/homophobic comments.

We may not always get things right, but it is never for the want of trying. As a practising Christian School, please can all parents be mindful of the 5 Ardeley Values of **Love** and **Compassion**, **Respect & Reverence**, **Wisdom**, **Hope and Friendship**.
